

Materials for Watercolor by Sally Meding

All products are available from Dick Blick.com

Basic supplies or the equivalent (that you already have) that we will be needing:

- Folding watercolor palette (eg. order#03001-0000) or similar. (I have Frank Webb Palette (only from Cheap Joes.com), but it is quite large.)
- 9x12" Arches cold press 140lb foldover pad of 100% cotton paper (order#10183-1010). Not the heavy block with black sides! ~ \$12 online. (This is the most important item)
- #12 Black Velvet round brush (Silver company) (order# 06196-1012), a size #8 is useful too)
- 1" flat wash brush (Simply Simmons flat wash with clear beveled handle) from Post Road Art Center, Marlboro or AC Moore. I will also have some available ~\$5
- #2 Rigger or script liner brush (order# 05566-7040-\$2).
- HB pencil (0.5mm mechanical), 12" ruler & kneaded eraser (eg. order#G139)
- #2 Scrubber brush to lift any mistakes. (order#06711-1002-Dick Blick). Very Useful!

Watercolor paint tubes: Either of these 2 choices: (first choice is the better option)

- 1) Daniel Smith 6 essentials professional set (order# 01767-1009) (~ \$33)
- PLUS Burnt sienna, Pbr7 Holbein (order# 00322-8042)
- sap green WN cotman (ord#00325-7091)
- Neutral tint WN prof (ord#00319-2551)

OR 2) Student-quality paints equivalent to colors above:

- a. Cadmium yellow medium hue, Grumbacher Academy (ord#00330-4191)
 - b. Indian yellow, Grumbacher academy (ord# 00330-4161)
 - c. Intense phthalo blue, Cotman (ord# 00325-5141-DickBlick)
 - d. Ultramarine blue, Cotman (ord# 00325-5231-DickBlick)
 - e. Permanent Rose, Cotman (ord# 00325-3261-DickBlick)
 - f. Cadmium red deep Hue (Cotman) (ord#00325-3321-DickBlick)
 - g. Burnt sienna Cotman (ord# 00325-8041-DickBlick)
 - h. Sap Green (ord#00325-7091-DickBlick)
 - Neutral tint (winsor newton Prof, (ord# 00319-2551)
- (All colors ~\$25)

12 Incidentals- probably you have most of these at home already.

- Roll of paper towels (really important)
- Masking tape, (1" wide, beige color)
- 11x14" piece of cardboard to "stretch" paper (2 pieces) and to lean on.
- Small "brick-sized" piece of styrofoam to create a 15 degree slope (or piece of pool noodle, small sturdy cardboard box ~ 2x4x5" (I will have a few))
- 2-3 Water buckets -eg. old very large yogurt 32oz carton or ¼ gal container. (Whole foods-large containers at salad bar work well too)
- Brush holder and stand for watercolor brushes which protects the points of brushes when not in use/in transit. optional but really useful. (A bamboo table mat to roll them in will work initially.)
- Travel sized misting bottle (eg from Christmas tree shop) ~\$0.99
- Teaspoon of regular table salt (in small baggie)
